

KNOW ABOUT YOUR **BREED'S LIFE SPAN?**



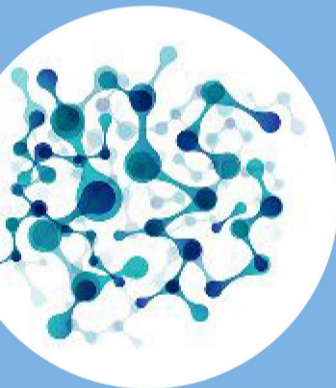
